October is here and with it my building season has kicked off in earnest. With the pathetic play of my beloved NY Giants this year I even have an extra few hours of free time on Sunday afternoons to move my projects along.

First up is Tony Bonetti's classic 70's pattern model, the Troublemaker. Always liked the jet like looks of this machine, and how fast it flew. Has been at least 25 years since I've built a model with foam wings so my first steps were to order a cache of contest balsa and start making the 1/16" balsa wing skins. While that's in process I've begun on the fuselage...amazing how small this model is for a '60' sized aircraft. It is a mere 2.25" wide, super tight to fit everything inside. I will have to think out the installation carefully ahead of time in order to shoehorn all radio equipment, engine and tank, etc. I need to fully lay out all the parts involved especially around the engine mount and nose landing gear assembly to ensure everything fits.

Since I have a really hard time focusing on just one project at a time, I have done some preliminary work on two other classic pattern models, an El Tigre and Joe Bridi's Sun Fli 5. I know the Bridi model will be an easy build and will fly great as do all of his designs, but if I can pull off the El Tigre I can guarantee there would not be another one flying anywhere so having something unique is appealing. I have short kits for both and have the foam cores for the El Tigre so I'll have to narrow down my focus soon.

Also not to forget I have a deBolt Equalizer framed up that I want to finish this year. I'm in the process of covering with silk and dope so there's hope to complete it this year.

Get up there and enjoy the field while you still can...soon we'll be back to this!

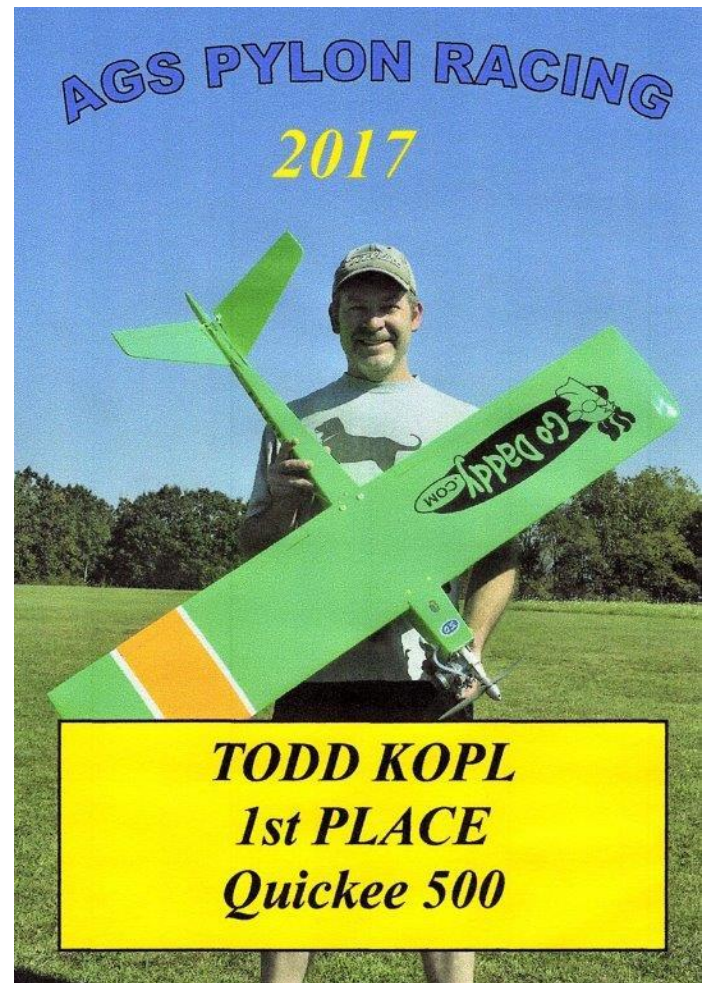


AGS Pylon Racing – submitted by Bob Noll

The 2017 AGS Float Fly got off on a rough start. Approximately 10 days before the float fly I received a call from the Greenwood Park manager. He explained that a dam improvement project that had been in the works for over 5 years was approved and they would begin draining the Greenwood Park lake that Friday. He expected the lake to be at an extremely low level by the time the float fly was scheduled to occur. Fortunately, I was able to work with the Broome County Parks System and the AMA to move the float fly from Greenwood Park to Nathaniel Cole Park. Word of the change in venue spread through social media and e-mail.

Saturday was not a spectacular day. Seven pilots registered to fly. We got a few morning flights in before a heavy mist took over around noon. We waited patiently under an easy up for the cloud to pass. A fairly stiff breeze limited the afternoon flights.

Sunday brought sunny weather and light winds. Six pilots from Saturday were joined by an additional six pilots. There wasn't a moment that planes were not in the air.
